Cllr M Blakeston reported that it was becoming increasingly frustrating, that hoped for plans for a minor injury's unit were now dashed as the funding had to be redirected elsewhere due to chronic shortages of GP's, that as the CCG was disbanded and undergoing transition to another body getting information

was very difficult and that he was unsure of how to proceed at this juncture. Cllr Paul Rounding assured Cllr Blakeston of the town council's continued support for the direction of the Healthy Towns Project Group and its aims and methods of approach, and proposed that a letter be written to Sir Greg Knight MP voicing our concerns at the state of healthcare provision in Driffield and the Wolds area, this was **agreed** with all in favour.
