#### 122/23 Public Discussion and Comment:

Supt French attended the meeting to explain that Driffield now had full 24/7 policing made up of 12 constables, and 2 sergeants. The 12 constables whilst new to Driffield are not all new in service. New cars have also been provided.

Now the dark nights are on us, increased foot patrols by the Police would be seen. Supt French reminded the room of the importance of logging issues via any of the channels available, including social media.

It was confirmed that the station will be manned Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and a 24hr buzzer is in place on the door. He offered to check the operation of the buzzer personally.

Constable Philips explained 4 assaults, 1 theft, 1 public order offence, 2 ASBO's and 1 act of arson had been logged. Operation Shield was ongoing with extra officers around the town.

The clerk has been given the opportunity for the CCTV to be fully monitored elsewhere and this will be followed up.
